All you need to do is make sure your mobile is less than 30ft away and it will work. There's also a free Android and iPhone app from Tivoli, who have sorted through the bewilder-

Easy Envelope Budget Aid (iPhone, free)

OK, so it's not quite as old-school as actually keeping your money in separate envelopes in a secret tin, but it works in the same way – just no tin, no money and the envelopes are virtual.

Check your budget quickly on your phone with a fixed number of envelopes (one for groceries, one for entertainment, one for eating out and so on).

If you want more than the 20 envelopes available in the free version, there are paid features you can add.

BUDGET phones often have small, low-resolution screens and shonky build quality. Not this one.

The 4in display is big and bright, with subtle colours and sharp detail.

The case is strong and feels good. The camera is a 5MP job and the Android software isn't quite the latest, but it's highly affordable.

THIS is a slick, powerful handset with the latest software, called Jelly Bean. It has a high-resolution 4.7in screen which looks as good as the iPhone's.

The build quality is exceptional, it's sleek and glossy, the 8MP camera is easy to use and a fast quad-core processor runs like the blazes.

And it costs a lot less than Apple's iPhone to boot.

PITY the rich guy. He wants everyone to know he's loaded but doesn't want a phone dripping in jewels. Thank goodness, then, for British firm Vertu.

The Ti is their first Android phone with a sapphire crystal screen that won't scratch when it touches your Rolex.
